The net is higher than gross ratio due to the recoupment of expenses as outlined in the prospectus. Please see the Prospectus for additional details. The net expense ratio represents what investors have paid as of March 31, 2025. The Fund's Adviser has contractually agreed to waive a portion of its fees and/or reimburse expenses such that the total operating expense (net) is 1.39% (for the lifetime of the Fund). In addition to the lifetime limit, the Adviser has agreed to reimburse the Fund to the extent necessary to ensure that total annual Fund operating expenses do not exceed 1.19% at least through April 1, 2026. The adviser is entitled to the reimbursement of fees waived or reimbursed by the Adviser to the Fund subject to the limitations that (1) the reimbursement is made only for fees and expenses incurred not more than three years prior to the date of reimbursement, and (2) the reimbursement may not be made if it would cause the Fund's annual expense limitation to be exceeded.
